The first Annual Meeting of the Friends of The Hollow a Society now incorporated by the Common Wealth of Virginia Corporation Commission, will be held Sunday Afternoon, November 8th, at two oclock in the Old Stone Church off Rt.#55 at Markham Va. on the old road to Front Royal..

The Agenda will include the presentation of the Charter, the presentation of the Constitution and By-Laws, the election of Officers, and discussion of plans for the Architectual and Historic evaluation of the Building.known as "The Hollow".

The objectives of this newly organised society are to restore and preserve the home built in 1765 by the Revolutionary War Officer, Colonel Thomas marshall. The Chief Justice of the United States between 1800 and the time of his death in 1836, John Marshall, and his brothers Revolutionary War Officers Capt. Thomas Marshall Jr. and Lt. James arkham Marshall spent eight of the most formative years of their lives in this dwelling.It is among the few remaining houses of the Pre-Revolutionary War period in Fauquier County which remains virtually unchanged.

Membership in this society is open to all persons who are interested in preserving this Historical Land Mark for posterity.
